
Request: To repeal Resolution 5603


It bans using paths, shoulders, bus stops and sidewalks

Bottom line: The same or better paths can be obtained everywhere along San Tomas. Both are arterial roads.

De la Cruz (40 mph) bridge shoulder for Caltrain patrons.



San Tomas (45 mph) bridge shoulder, which is:





- Wider (even fits SUV, shown for scale)
- Safer (no on-ramp, no off-ramp)
- Safer than the one mile walking detour
- Avoids traffic lane of Martin Av (40 mph)

Path (Creek Trail) is planned for 2007.

Lafayette (40 mph): No paths, shoulders or sidewalks here; Walkers use traffic lane at parked cars.



San Tomas (45 mph): Path and shoulder for entire block!



- Shoulders are required for bicycles (since 1989) on all "expressway" arterial roads.
- How can the shoulder be safe for bicycles, but the path be unsafe for walkers (as staff claims)?

Most shoulders along San Tomas are twice as wide as a bike lane. Walkers use edge of pavement.



Here, I was given a \$149 ticket because City and County staff stonewalled on compliance with the Master Plan.



Staff quote: "Maintain pedestrian prohibition on San Tomas." Res. 5603 even bans bus stop use.

Staff omitted information to this Council and the Bicycle Advisory Committee

- Staff prevented the Committee from reading the County Expressway Master Plan's "Pedestrian Element" by only distributing it at the meeting.
- Staff omitted this document from the Council and didn't even mention it.
 Yet, staff is asking Council to request the Supervisors to violate it and ignore the public hearing process that occurred (2002-2003).
- Staff ignored all other violated policies and laws on my list, without rejecting or agreeing.
